Recombinant Human Macrophage Inflammatory protein-1 alpha (CCL3), His Tag

Macrophage Inflammatory Proteins (MIP) belongs to the family of chemotactic Cytokines known as chemokines. In humans, there are two major forms, MIP-1 α and MIP-1 β that are now officially named CCL3 and CCL4 respectively. Both are major factors produced by macrophages after they are stimulated with bacterial endotoxins. They activate human granulocytes (neutrophils, eosinophils and basophils) which can lead to acute neutrophilic inflammation. They also induce the synthesis and release of other pro-inflammatory cytokines such as interleukin 1(IL-1), IL-6 and TNF- α from fibroblasts and macrophages. The genes for CCL3 and CCL4 are both located on human chromosome 17.

Macrophage Inflammatory Protein-1 alpha His Human Recombinant produced in E.Coli is a single, non-glycosylated, polypeptide chain containing 68 amino acids and having a molecular mass of 7820 Dalton with an amino-terminal hexahistidine tag. The MIP-1a-His is purified by proprietary chromatographic techniques. CCL3 His-Tag is supplied in 1x PBS and 50% glycerol.

Applications and Suggested Dilutions: Greater than 95.0% as determined by: (a) Analysis by RP-HPLC. (b) Analysis by SDS-PAGE. Users must optimize the appropriate concentration and conditions for each assay.

Storage and Stability: Store CCL3 at 4°C if entire vial will be used within 2-4 weeks. Store, frozen at -20°C for longer periods of time. Please avoid freeze thaw cycles. If supplied in powder then reconstitute it in 100 ul water for 1 mg/ml stock and store in liquid at 4°C for ~1 week or aliquots in suitable size and store at -20°C for long term storage.
